

While we are out at club dances, committee meetings, and other functions, often the topic comes up, "How can we increase our club membership?" Now, this doesn't necessarily mean the same thing to every club. For instance, there may be a club struggling along with seven couples that wants additional members simply in order to survive. Then there may be a club that has a regular attendance of five squares, but remembers that last year it was six squares, and the year before, seven squares. Another club may find it has become so inbred that it has lost its spark of enthusiasm. Still another club, successful for many years, may suddenly find that a large percentage of its members are moving to other parts of the country, as an effort to downsize or retire. And then there may be a club that finds that with its dwindling membership, it can no longer afford the upkeep on the hall where they dance.

So what's the answer? The most obvious answer, and one that a lot of clubs give a lot of time and thought to, is to hold regular beginner classes. We want to explore here a few other thoughts on the subject. Let's start by each club looking sincerely at their roster and attendance. Perhaps club membership numbers are actually pretty good, but only a small percentage of dancers keep coming. Ask yourselves, are these the same members who attend each time, or are all the members coming, but only spasmodically? If the same people are the only ones showing up time after time, it may show an interest in your club only among this select few, and these diehards are determined to keep the club going regardless. If all members come, but not regularly, could it be that the members want the club to be successful, but many are disappointed when they come and so only show up periodically.

Let's get realistic about this. Look back at when members began to be less enthusiastic. See if there was a change at that. It could be club policy, or cliques started forming, or a caller change. Or if none of this applies, maybe a policy change is needed now. What happened to those dancers who used to belong to your club, to those

ASSOCIATION AND CLUB LEADERSHIP

From the Valley Circle—April 1990


There are 74 square and round dance clubs in the Vancouver, Lower Mainland, and Fraser Valley areas and all of them comprise the Fraser Valley Square & Round Dance Association.

The Association Executive Committee meet regularly in order to establish and maintain certain rules and guidelines for the benefit of these clubs. With the approval of the member dance club directors, the rules and guidelines have been the cornerstone on which we have a fairly solid base of square dancing enjoyment for thousands of dancers in this area for many years,

Although the Association Executive Committee meets regularly to deal with the "nuts and bolts" part of the organization they do open up their meetings four times a year as General Meetings which all dancers are invited to attend. One designated club member only is allowed to vote on any and all motions made at these meetings and all motions are carried or defeated by a majority vote. It is only through direct representation at the general meetings and by making your vote count that you can determine that the Association will follow a popular course of action required by the majority of dancers. However, club representation at most general meetings averages about 50% attendance. That's about 35 to 40 club representatives.

Is this really enough clout to honestly say, on any motion, that "this is what the dancer wants"?

Perhaps it is. But what concerns us most is that a lot of what goes on at these meetings is determined by the same clubs who are dedicated enough to consistently attend these meetings. Now, if the 50% of the clubs who rarely attend, or do not attend, the meetings do not object to other club representatives making decisions that

will inevitably affect them, then so be it. The Association, the meetings, the elections, the decisions, etc., will carry on just as they have done for years.

This may not be an entirely bad thing, according to some people, but then again, with the changing time and changing attitudes the idea of "standing pat" would appear to be tantamount to a quick slide downhill for a movement such as ours. When faced with the known competition for the average persons recreation time we are indeed facing a challenge of major proportions in just maintaining our current square dancers, let a lone recruiting new dancers.

The natural tendency to relax in front of the fire after a day's work is made easier by the ready availability of T.V., video tapes, stereo, etc., all there at one's fingertips, why then should one go out to square dance? Or, to anything else for that matter. All competition for the recreation time and dollar starts at this point and we in square dancing should be constantly aware of the continuing need to be alert to shifts of recreation trends and to meet them head on!

On November 5th, 1989, the Association had a luncheon general meeting which also entailed a round table discussion for area clubs representatives, who were posed three questions for discussion, as follows:

- 1. What does your club expect from the association?
- 2. How do we get dancers to act as executives?
- 3. Why do we lose dancers?

The answers to the questions were, of course, many and varied but in the interest of keeping this article to less than "novel" size we have condensed them as follows and it's not surprising that the most quoted answer to the first question was;


- 1. (A) Provide leadership and guidance.
 - (B) Promotion committee should be more "visible"

- 3. (A) Callers not keeping up with continuous training, styling, interesting programming and encouragement.
 - (B) Callers should discourage dancers from dancing above their level. By not doing so this creates discussion in experienced dancers because squares frequently breakdown!
 - (C) Good attentive follow up on absent dancers to let them know they are missed and to keep them informed of the latest club news.

Of course, the questions and the answers beg for discussion and rightly so. But where do we go from here? Having discussed the questions and decided on a course of correction (the answers!) what happens now? Based on past experience in the square dance movement I'm committed to answering this question by saying, nothing! We do seem to have a penchant for indentifying problems in square dancing, discussing them and.......doing nothing!

So, maybe the time is ripe for a leadership seminar within our area to discuss the dancers' concerns and try to iron out some of the irritation wrinkles that somehow mar our total enjoyment of square dancing. The seminar we visualize would be different in one major aspect from other leadership seminars in that we would wish to see not only discussions held on these and other subjects related to square dancing, but decisions made and entered as future policy for either the association and/or clubs. The caller/teachers association would be an integral part of the seminar since our enjoyment of square dancing hinges also on the full co-operation and the expertise of our callers. For instance, just how involved in the club should the caller be, or, put it another way, how distant should the caller be in his dealings with the club.

It appears to us that a "lack of communication" is also at fault in that not a lot of dancers are aware of the hierarchy, where the club or the association or the federation is placed or what these bodies do for them. If all our clubs advertised in the Valley Circle, and if all our dancers subscribed to the Valley Circle, then we would not have such a wide gap in our communications. As it stands now, the only communication between the federation, the association, and the clubs is through the club reps attending general meetings and not all dancers subscribe to the Valley Circle we'd have to say we are not communicating completely.

So what to do about communication? Well, as a start, why not consider a subscription to the Valley Circle as part of the dancer's annual club membership fee. This then would serve two purposes. Firstly all dancers would have the opportunity to know what is going on in their area on a monthly basis re: dances, special or otherwise, and the association would undoubtedly provide more information on a regular basis re: current policy, decisions and awards, etc., Who knows, with increased readership and increased interest we may find the hidden talent out there who may submit an article or two of interest. If the reader has a question on square dancing policy, etc., why not write a "letter to the editor ", who undoubtedly would refer to the respective authority and publish your question and the official answer.

Good communication is one of the key factors in any organization. As square dancers we have ample means of communication at every level and at every position, and an answer awaits every question. We just "under-utilize" this asset mostly to a point where we suddenly discover what we could done - after the event! The square



Resettled in Aldergrove, she said yes when John Corrigan asked her if she would be interested in cueing for the White Rockers Club. We are glad she said yes, and we know we are lucky to have her.

When programming dances for the afternoon, Pat usually starts with a peppy tune to get people in the mood to have fun. She makes sure to include dances which are not too difficult. She also introduces the Round of the Month when they are selected, for which she reviews the steps that may be more challenging. I would add the observation that she also chooses some beautiful ballads, which are as dreamy to listen to as they are to watch.

little harder on the body than square dancing. She suggests this is possibly why there has been a drop off in the number of people wanting to learn round dancing. But Pat has included some mixers in her selection of dances, and we all get up on the floor for those. Perhaps this could be the start of getting even more round dancers on the floor in the future. Thank you to Pat for providing interesting information about round dancing, and for sharing her love of this dancing with our club.

As we approach the end of this session of Sunday dances for the White Rock Club, I would encourage everyone to comb through The Valley Circle for information about opportunities for dancing during the summer break. Stay active. Dance if you can find
