

## The Latest on Restrictions

First—What does the PHO say:

(https://www2.gov.bc.ca/gov/content/covid-19/info/restrictions) Remember—Our Activity is not "DANCING" it's a fitness activity.

### **Exercise and fitness**

- Full capacity is allowed for exercise and fitness activities, including:
- Adult indoor individual, group fitness or exercise activities
- Adult dance classes and activities
- Exercise and fitness programs for children and youth

Safety requirements for exercise and fitness activities include:


- Proof of vaccination required for entry (12+)
- Masks required at all times, except when actively exercising. We strongly encourage people to wear a mask even when exercising

#### What does at this mean:

- To start dancing clubs need a COVID-19 Safety Plan
- The Plan must include Vaccine Passport Checking with App. With picture ID required the first time a dancer attends
- Masks "encouraged" but not "required"
- Masks Club decision but may be required by hall
- Food no problems BUT .....
- BABY STEPS !!!!!!
- Masks maybe uncomfortable for you but may make others more comfortable
- Food masks maybe required in line up to get food but not while eating (again hall rules may override)
- This is ONLY TRUE for DANCE CLASSES. If the club is holding a "DANCE" like a themed dance Masks would be required at all times!!!!!!
- A "COVID-19 Safety Plan Template" for clubs to use is available

With all this said:

- I can tell you what CAN be done
- What a club must consider what we CAN do is different than what we SHOULD do
  - Some dancers wish we never quit
  - Some dancers are ready now
  - Some dancers may be ready soon
  - Some dancers may never be ready
  - Some dancers may return to ROUNDS only
- A club must consider their membership when deciding when and if they restart dancing.


At times, we would have a few four person squares and when enough dancers were present these would be combined to make up two squares.
