Maybe the anticipation will make them better.

In the meantime, there are still a few things we might do to keep our square dancing spirits alive. How about 8 dancers gather their cars in a suitably-sized parking lot, and have a caller in a car close by with a megaphone or loudspeaker. When the cars are assembled in a square formation, the caller can call some simple moves, and following the criteria that the Wheeling 8 wheelchair dancers use for their moves, such as keep right to pass, etc., we could video-tape a scene of "car square-dancing". That might be fun and raise some interest in our recreation.

The BC Government has a volunteer line for seniors, which is phone 2-1-1. We are often willing volunteers, so maybe checking out this service could give us a sense of helping our community at large. Also, if any of our dancers, callers, members need help at this time, the service might be a good way to reach a volunteer who can help. Music sharing for those who have Facebook and other social media could be a fun way to connect. Share your favourite song, and pass on some square dance moves you'd like to hear recorded to that song. Lights or pictures of hope in our windows (i.e. hearts, rainbows or whatever) could be a fun thing to do. Share your thoughts with others on email of how you got involved in square dancing, what you most enjoy about it, and what is the first thing you will do when we get going again, and let the Valley Circle and website have a copy. And send some extra support and caring to our Teen Clubs, who have always been an inspiration, and whose hard work, training, preparations, hopes and dreams have been postponed for this year because of the

Square & Round Dancing in the New Normal Bv: Dr. J. Blair Wallace

While we are waiting for square and round dancing to restart – it's maybe time to think about what our activity will look like in what many are calling the "New Normal". The Public Health Officer has suggested that companies and organizations develop their own methods to meet the challenges of the "new normal". So in light of this, I am presenting the following to start a discussion of what our activity will look like when the restrictions are begin to be lifted.

In my professional life I develop policies and procedures for companies that when implemented allow the companies to meet regulatory requirements. The procedure component often requires employees to change how they do things to meet the safety and environmental requirements. In the development of the policies and procedures, the first step is to recognize the status of the current activities that cannot continue within the new environment. So, let's do that with square dancing - once the limits on the size of groups are lifted.... (and until a vaccine is developed).

Within safety planning, controls can be put into place that provide a means to meet the protection that the requirement meets. For example (simplified) – you should not work in a dust filled environment but if I give you a respirator you can.

The difficulty we face is that square and round dancing are the antithesis of social distancing – but can we put measures (controls) in place to meet the purpose of social distancing and still enjoy our activity?? Here are my suggestions:

• Dancers will need to make face masks a required part of their outfits – i.e. face masks are worn by all dancers – all the time;



the virus situation. The beginners have been taught all of the 68 basic moves as well as the 25 Mainstream moves and only need a little more floor time to raise their skill level. Considering that most – if not all – clubs have shut down for now; floor time is probably out of the question for now. Perhaps if all goes well, the virus problem will be gone soon and our Club can plan for some dances (and floor time) in the summer months. As for next season, Chilliwack Rhythm Reelers is making something of a radical shift for our beginners. Yes, we will still have a new session in September (date to be announced) but CRR will be testing out the 'Callerlab Sustainable Square Dancing (SSD) 50 Move program'. This program will be offering multiple class starts per year - one in September and one in January (date to be determined). My source says that the Swinging Singles, Town 'n' Country Dancers and White Rockers clubs began using the SSD program for their lessons in September, 2019. The Chilliwack Rhythm Reelers have agreed to use the SSD program starting in September 2020.

This year was a difficult year from a membership point of view. As of January 1st, our membership count went from 79 down to 61 (a difference of 18) primarily due to medical conditions that prevented people from dancing. Fortunately, our 17 new beginners filled the void, so overall we were only down 1 membership leaving our total paid membership at 78.

It was so sad to hear of the passing of Howard (Howie) Long in February. Even though he and his wife Sandie were no longer dancing as Rhythm Reelers in Chilliwack, it is still sad news to hear of the loss of a former dancer.

Our next items scheduled after the Rally are our Chilliwack Rhythm Reelers Annual General meeting (AGM) and our CRR members-only annual BBQ. Hopefully these will not have to be delayed as well.

In the last chatter, I mentioned about our PUB night fund-raiser on February 29th and what a success it was. Our net proceed from the event was over \$1,000.00 and this will become an annual event although the venue may change due to the overwhelming attendance.

That's it for now. I am waiting in anticipation for Rose-Lynn to return to her 'portfolio' as Club Chatter representative for Chilliwack Rhythm Reelers where she will resume doing an excellent job. I trust that my Club Chatters have not been too disappointing but informative overall. I do try my best and that's all one can hope for.

- Clubs will need to provide hand sanitizer at all activities;
- Clubs will need to have single use face masks available for dancers who forget / do not have masks;
- Clubs will need to explain to dancers how to put on and take off face masks (i.e. put it on / take it off without touching the inside / outside of the cloth portion);
- Clubs need to insure washrooms at all facilities are properly equipped and supplied with sanitizer, soap and hot water;
- Clubs will need to wipe down all surfaces before and after use;
- Common / shared food tables will be a significant challenge and will likely need to be eliminated;
- Callers / cuers will need to use their own microphones and have a separate microphone for the club to use for announcements, etc.;
- Clubs will need to post signs telling dancers:
 - To wear face masks;
 - To limit touching their faces;
 - To stay home if they feel ill;
 - To wash their hands often.

Note that I do not suggest using gloves. Studies have shown that gloves present a false sense of security as people actually wash their hands **less** when gloves are worn. Further, COVID-19 is spread by droplets, it makes no difference if you touch a contaminated surface with or without a gloved hand – and then touch your face.

These are my preliminary thoughts – and I encourage your feedback. Whatever we develop must make dancers be safe and feel safe. Email me at valleycircle@shaw.ca.

The data and all the ways it can be examined excite me! I couldn't help myself. I had to do my own math. On March 16th, here in BC, our number of new reported cases per day jumped from single digits (except for 03-13) to 30. From that date till April 2nd when I was seized with the need to do some math, our average number of new reported cases per day was 58.2. So it seemed clear to me that any day after that we have fewer than 58 new cases was a better day. I am writing this on April 4th, and the new cases yesterday, the 3rd, were 53, and the new cases today were 29. It would be so great if that number kept shrinking. Time will tell.

I have confidence in the virology researchers working right now to find out how to conquer this new corona virus. I miss my 3 adult kids and their spouses; I miss my friends. I miss traveling to dance and call or cue everywhere I wish to. What will the future hold? Well, I have concluded, without a doubt, we will dance again. We will travel again, and hug and hold our children, grandchildren, and great-grands.

I love you, Valley Promenaders!! We'll be back a.s.a.p. I love you, square dance friends!! Keep the faith!! Even during this time of crisis, please love deeply, laugh long and loud, and celebrate life in some way every day.


