




The FVS&RDA has a committee headed by Blair Wallace, which is gathering information to help clubs plan a safe and sensible start to their dance season.

It is he cooperation and working together of all the dancers in this Association that make it so strong and successful. Let's keep it that way and build on it, in a positive rather than a negative manner.







A Plan to A Plan to Get Back to Dancing Safely in BC Under COVID-19—New Information

by the FVS&RDA COVID-19 Return to Dance Committee August 8, 2020

We added a preamble to the Plan to a Plan Document as a result for a new Order from the Public Health Office and a Ministerial Order. I have included the two orders on the pages following this preamble.

Previous versions of this Plan to a Plan document assumed that there would be easing of the restrictions as time passed under Phase 3 of BC Restart Plan. What we did not expect is a tightening of restrictions that are contained in a new Order of the Provincial Health Officer. This new Order was prompted by the spread of the virus that resulted following gatherings in Kelowna and Vancouver.

The new restrictions were released by the Public Health Officer ("PHO") in an Order dated July 27, 2020, amended to August 7, 2020. The new order applies to all "Events". An Event is separated from a "Destination" such as a grocery store, beach, etc. The difference between and "Event" and a "Destination" is the control of access, egress and the activities of the patrons.

According to the Order, an Event is defined as:

"event" refers to anything which gathers people together whether on a onetime, regular or irregular basis, including a party, worship service, ceremony or celebration of any type, reception, wedding, funeral, celebration of life, musical, theatrical or dance entertainment or performance, live band performance, disc jockey performance, strip dancing, comedic act, art show, magic show, puppet show, fashion show, book signing, reading, recitation, display, movie, film; meeting, conference, lecture, talk, educational presentation (except in a school or post-secondary educational institution); auction, fund raising benefit, contest, quiz, game, rally, festival, presentation, demonstration, or sporting or other physical activity, exhibition and fair;

Under this definition, our activity would be an "Event" as it is clearly a "physical activity". Other parts of the definition my also apply.

Under the new Order, the following restrictions apply (inter alia):

- 4. An owner or operator of a place may permit up to fifty patrons to attend an event in a place if the following conditions are met:
 - a. there is an organizer of the event;
 - if the organizer is not the owner or operator of the place the organizer must provide the owner or operator with the first and last names and telephone number, or email address, of the patrons who attend the event;
 - c. access to the event is controlled;
 - d. the number of patrons is closely monitored;
 - e. there is sufficient space available to permit the patrons to maintain a distance of two metres from one another;

- f. the patrons maintain a distance of two metres from one another when standing or sitting, unless they belong to the same party;
- g. if there are tables provided for the use of patrons, no more than six patrons sit at a table, even if they belong to the same party, and there are at least two metres between the backs of the chairs at one table and the backs of the chairs at another table, unless the chairs are separated by a physical barrier;
- h. if live performance is provided, or there is a presenter or a presider, a physical barrier must be installed between the performer, presenter or presider and the patrons which blocks the transmission of droplets from the performer, presenter or presider, or there must be at least a three metre separation between the performer, presenter or the presider and the patrons.
- i. hand sanitation supplies are readily available to patrons;
- there are washroom facilities available with running water, soap and a sanitary means for drying hands for hand washing purposes or hand sanitation supplies.
- 5. The organizer must ensure that the conditions in section 4 are met.
- 6. The organizer must
 - a. collect the first and last names and telephone number, or email address, of every patron who attends an event or of every driver of a vehicle present at a drive-in event; and
 - b. retain this information for thirty days, in case there is a need for contact tracing on the part of the medical health officer, in which case the information must be provided to the medical health officer.

The "Plan to a Plan" was therefore be updated to meet these new requirements. Specifically, the requirements laid out in 4(e), 4(f) and 4(g). The other requirements of this new order were already considered.

The major change in the "Plan for a Plan" is the requirement that a 2 m space is required between "patrons" at all times. This means that 2 m spacing must be maintained from anyone outside of your family bubble whether dancing or not and whether you are wearing a mask or not.

This means with respect to the dancing:

- For Squares Couples must be 2 m apart and not interact with each other
- For Rounds Couples must be 2 m apart
- For Contra Couples must be 2 m apart and not interact with each other
- For Clogging Dancers must be 2 m apart
- For Line Dancing Dancers must be 2 m apart

Of course, all the other restrictions outlined in the Plan to a Plan document must also be in place in the written plan. Failure to meet and enforce these requirements can lead to a \$2,000 fine for the preside and \$200 fines to those attending such events or promoting attendance at such events.

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF PUBLIC SAFETY AND SOLICITOR GENERAL

Emergency Program Act

Ministerial Order No. M314

WHEREAS a declaration of a state of emergency throughout the whole of the Province of British Columbia was declared on March 18, 2020 because of the COVID-19 pandemic;

AND WHEREAS additional enforcement measures for gatherings and events are necessary to protect public safety and alleviate the effects of the COVID-19 pandemic;

AND WHEREAS section 10 (1) of the *Emergency Program Act* provides that I may do all acts and implement all procedures that I consider necessary to prevent, respond to or alleviate the effects of any emergency or disaster;

I, Mike Farnworth, Minister of Public Safety and Solicitor General, order that the attached Gatherings and Events (COVID-19) Order is made.

GATHERINGS AND EVENTS (COVID-19) ORDER

Definition

1 In this order, "Gatherings and Events Order" means the order entitled "Gatherings and Events" made by the provincial health officer on August 7, 2020, as amended from time to time.

Adoption by reference

- The provisions of the Gatherings and Events Order are deemed to be provisions of this order.
 - (2) For certainty,
 - (a) a contravention of the Gatherings and Events Order is a contravention of this order, and
 - (b) the definitions in the Gatherings and Events Order apply to this order.

Non-compliant gatherings and events

- 3 Sections 4 and 5 apply to the following social gatherings and events:
 - (a) a social gathering or event that contravenes section 1 of the Gatherings and Events Order;
 - (b) an event that contravenes section 3 or 8 of the Gatherings and Events Order;
 - (c) an event that does not meet the conditions of section 4 of the Gatherings and Events Order.

No promotion or encouragement

4 A person must not promote a social gathering or event referred to in section 3 or encourage another person to attend such a social gathering or event.

Law enforcement officers

5 A person who attends or promotes a social gathering or event referred to in section 3 must comply with any direction given by a law enforcement officer, including a direction to disperse.

Abusive or belligerent behaviour

- 6 A person must not engage in abusive or belligerent behaviour towards another person
 - (a) at a social gathering in vacation accommodation,
 - (b) at an event, or
 - (c) in any premises, as defined in the order entitled "Restaurants, Coffee Shops, Cafes, Cafeterias and Licensed Premises, Including Pubs, Bars, Lounges, Nightclubs and Tasting Rooms" made by the provincial health officer on July 31, 2020, as amended from time to time.

Compliance by patrons


- 7 (1) A patron who attends an event must comply with the conditions set out in section 4 (f) and (g) of the Gatherings and Events Order.
 - (2) A patron who attends a drive in must

- (a) comply with the condition set out in section 8 (a) of the Gatherings and Events Order,
- (b) stay in the patron's vehicle except to use washroom facilities, and
- (c) when outside the patron's vehicle, maintain a distance of two metres from other patrons.

Enforcement information to minister

8 A law enforcement agency and a local government must provide the minister with information in its possession, other than personal information, that the minister requests respecting the enforcement of this order by the law enforcement agency or the local government.

TO: OWNERS AND OPERATORS OF PLACES AND PERSONS WHO ORGANIZE OR ATTEND EVENTS AT VACATION ACCOMODATION OR OTHER PLACES

WHEREAS:

- On March 17, 2020 I provided notice under section 52 (2) of the *Public Health Act* that the
 transmission of the infectious agent SARS-CoV-2, which has caused cases and outbreaks
 of a serious communicable disease known as COVID-19 among the population of the
 Province of British Columbia, constitutes a regional event as defined in section 51 of the *Public Health Act*;
- The SARS-CoV-2 virus, an infectious agent, can cause outbreaks of COVID-19;
- A person infected with SARS-CoV-2 can infect other people with whom the infected person is in direct contact, through droplets in the air, or from fluid containing SARS-CoV-2 left on surfaces;
- The gathering together of people indoors or outdoors for the purpose of attending an event can promote the transmission of SARS-CoV-2 and increase the number of people who develop COVID-19;
- 5. For certainty, this Order does not apply to workers at a worksite when engaged in their work activities, workers living at a work camp; students, teachers or instructors at a school or post-secondary educational institution when engaged in educational activities; customers in a mall or retail establishment when engaged in shopping activities or seeking services; individuals attending an episodic vending market; individuals in a recreation centre, campground or any other place when not attending an event or to premises subject to the

- For further certainty, this Order applies to meetings or conferences held in hotels or anywhere else.
- 7. I have reason to believe and do believe that
 - the risk of an outbreak of COVID-19 among the public constitutes a health hazard under the *Public Health Act*;
 - (ii) because the risk of outbreaks resulting from the gathering of people and attendance at events extends beyond the authority of one or more medical health officers and coordinated action is needed to protect the public from contracting COVID-19, it is in the public interest for me to exercise the powers in sections 30, 31, 32 and 39(3) of the Public Health Act TO ORDER as follows:

THIS ORDER REPEALS AND REPLACES MY ORDER OF JULY 27, 2020 WITH RESPECT TO GATHERINGS AND EVENTS

Definitions in this Order:

"event" refers to anything which gathers people together whether on a one-time, regular or irregular basis, including a party, worship service, ceremony or celebration of any type, reception, wedding, funeral, celebration of life, musical, theatrical or dance entertainment or performance, live band performance, disc jockey performance, strip dancing, comedic act, art show, magic show, puppet show, fashion show, book signing, reading, recitation, display, movie, film; meeting, conference, lecture, talk, educational presentation (except in a school or post-secondary educational institution); auction, fund raising benefit, contest, quiz, game, rally, festival, presentation, demonstration, or sporting or other physical activity, exhibition and fair;

"organizer" means the person responsible for organizing an event and the person who acts as host at an event:

"owner" includes an occupier or operator or person otherwise responsible for a place;

"patron" means an individual who attends an event but does not include staff;

"physical barrier" means a barrier which is designed, installed and maintained in accordance with WorksafeBC guidelines;

"a place" may be inside or outside, and does not include vacation accommodation;

- A maximum of five individuals may attend a social gathering or an event in vacation accommodation, in addition to the occupants.
- The owner of vacation accommodation must require any tenant, guest or other person using or occupying the vacation accommodation to comply with the requirement in section 1.
- Subject to section 8, the gathering of more than fifty patrons at a place for the purpose of an event is prohibited.
- 4. An owner or operator of a place may permit up to fifty patrons to attend an event in a place if the following conditions are met:
 - a. there is an organizer of the event;
 - if the organizer is not the owner or operator of the place the organizer must provide the owner or operator with the first and last names and telephone number, or email address, of the patrons who attend the event;
 - c. access to the event is controlled;
 - d. the number of patrons is closely monitored;
 - there is sufficient space available to permit the patrons to maintain a distance of two metres from one another;
 - f. the patrons maintain a distance of two metres from one another when standing or sitting, unless they belong to the same party;
 - g. if there are tables provided for the use of patrons, no more than six patrons sit at a table, even if they belong to the same party, and there are at least two metres between the backs of the chairs at one table and the backs of the chairs at another table, unless the chairs are separated by a physical barrier;

- 7. If the organizer is not the owner or operator, the owner or operator must
 - a. satisfy themselves that the organizer is aware of the requirements in sections 4, 5 and 6 and, if applicable, section 8, and has the capacity to fulfill them, and
 - b. retain the names of and contact information for the patrons provided by the organizer for thirty days, in case there is a need for contact tracing on the part of the medical health officer, in which case the information must be provided to the medical health officer.
- 8. If the event is a drive in, the owner or operator may permit more than fifty patrons to be present, if the following conditions, as well as the conditions in section 4, are met:
 - a. patrons only attend in a vehicle;
 - b. no more than fifty vehicles are present at the drive in;
 - patrons are informed that they must stay in their vehicles except to use washroom
 facilities, and when outside their vehicles they must maintain a distance of two
 metres from other patrons, and this is monitored;
 - d. no food or drink is sold.

his Order does not have an expiration date.

Upcoming Issues of the Valley Circle—Revised

Right now we don't have a clear idea of when we will be back to dancing. Based on the information we have available right now, I anticipate some round dancing might start in January of 2021. I don't see that square dancing will start until the Summer of 2021 at the earliest. With this in mind, we will continue "publishing" Valley Circles according to the normal schedule but:

- We will not be <u>printing</u> a Valley Circle (available online only) thru to sometime in 2021;
- We will be posting updates to information pertaining to the work of the COVID-19 Restart Committee and any orders from the BC Government or Public Health Office online
- No formal Valley Circle will be published online for the foreseeable future;
- We will not be requesting the Directory information until we see some indication that dancing will be restarting;
- We will not be selling subscriptions for the 2020/2021 dance year (we will extend the current subscriptions to September 2021);
- BUT if clubs begin dancing before January 2021 we will bill for ads i.e. if the club is dancing they will be billed.

This is the current plan – and it may be modified as more information is learned.


