Hello to all clubs and dancers.

The Rhythm Reelers started dancing on March 1st of this year and it was reasonably successful. Of course, our Club took a hit at our membership count due to Covid and its various variants. Covid reduced our Club paid membership down to 60 paid members (from a high of 80 members) but there are 13 people who have stated that they will return in September of this year. This total does not include any beginners who may join our Club membership in the near future which could ultimately bring our membership count back up to approximately 80 which is our normal count. This year we had 26 starting beginners with approximately 12-13 showing up on any given beginner's night. For most of our dance season (March to May), our beginner's class usually had 5 or 6 squares. With respect to our beginners, our youngest is 11 years old and everyone at our Club just adores her. Our next youngest is 20 years old. The 11 year old is becoming an excellent dancer whereas the 20 year old has had square dancing experience since 7 years of age and it shows. She can dance Plus and can dance in either the man or woman's positions at the drop of a pin. These two dancers are a great addition to our Club. Our beginner dancers have completed their SSD (Social Square Dancing) sessions. For those who do not know what SSD is, it is a beginner/ Mainstream program where only a portion of dance moves are taught. Rather than the normal 69 basic moves followed by 25 Mainstream moves, the SSD program teaches 51 frequently called moves. The theory behind this is that it graduates beginners much earlier so that they can participate in dances much faster. Then as time goes on, they learn the remaining moves to complete the Mainstream program. This is being tried at several halls and our hall is one of these sites. The time frame to complete the SSD program is a maximum of 14 weeks (3 ¹/₂ months) rather than the normal 32 or 33 weeks (8 months) for the full Mainstream set. SSD may seem rather aggressive but in reality, it consists of 2-3 extra moves being taught per week.

Our hall is now owned by the City of Chilliwack as a heritage site. In addition, the Atchelitz Women's Group will manage the day-to-day operation of the hall. I will say that working with the City – as with any government office - has been a real challenge to say the least. A major break from the 'norm' was our Club switching venues from Greendale School to Atchelitz Hall for our beginners. The reasons for this switch were that Atchelitz Hall has a better dance floor, is more centrally located, has far better acoustics for calling and is less expensive. It seemed like a 'no-brainer' to dance at a superior hall and save money on rentals. In addition, our Thursday beginner classes were moved to Friday to accommodate our caller's new work schedule.

To encourage dancers from other clubs to attend our regular dances, the guest price was reduced from \$7 to \$6 on Tuesday nights and \$6 to \$5 on Friday nights. In other words, everyone pays \$6 or \$5 depending on a specific night. In addition, any person who paid for a Tuesday night is welcome to come to the following Friday night dance at no charge. I am hoping that we can continue this fee structure for the remainder of the calendar year.

Our Club received a donation from the Lower Mainland Square and Round Dance Building Society. This money was originally intended to build a common Square and Round Dance facility. That project's target funds were eventually determined to not be reachable and what was raised already was distributed to the square dance community.

At the suggestion of one of our Executive members, an 'Ambassador' program has been started whereby retirees from dancing will volunteer their services at dances and special functions. Examples of services are greeters, 50/50 sellers, registration duties, etc. This will enable other dancers to participate in dancing without taking away their time for these functions.

Our Club did a membership vote as to whether or not to show the vaccination (VAX) passports at our hall even though the Public Health Office (PHO) has said that it was not necessary. The vote was to continue to provide vaccination proof for **first time dancers to our hall this year**. This procedure will be reviewed prior to the September 6^{th} start and possibly based on the PHO recommendations at that time. In September, our Club will probably start up a modified coffee/tea after-dance gathering (based on the PHO recommendations as well).

There was no Rally in the Valley this year due to lack of planning time but next year looks promising for the Rally. In its place for this year, our Club held a dance (with our 2 callers) for our Beginner, Mainstream and Plus dancers and it also included a recycle sale. The purpose of the dance was to meld all of our groups into one cohesive Club unit as well as have our beginners learn to dance to different callers. The event included various workshops, a picnic and an evening dance. The entire event ran from 1:00 PM to 9:00 PM for a total of 8 hours including breaks. We were also fortunate enough to have received so many recycled clothes that our selection was probably 3 to 4 times our normal volume. In addition, the articles for sale were extremely well priced (most at \$5.00). The Executive thanks everyone who contributed their time and effort to make this sale a success. The dance itself generated a lot of revenue for the Club and even after paying for 2 callers and the hall rental, we still managed to turn a profit of \$565.00. Both callers remarked that the dance appeared to be a success and I would have to agree with them. The dancers loved the format and it really helped to make our Club function as one. Other clubs should take note about incorporating a dance solely for their beginners and seasoned dancers - our Club recommends it.

Well, that's the status report from the Chilliwack Club. Keep **November 5th** (Saturday) in mind. That's our big duet night with Brent Mawdsley and Heather Reynolds (the dynamic duo) and if the last time we had this duo is any indication, it will be great. In 2019 when we last held this event, we had 88 dancers (11 squares). More details will be forthcoming after the summer.

By for now. See you on **September 6th** for Plus and Mainstream teach (with Brent Mawdsley) and **September 9th** for Beginner lessons (with Mike Rohde).

Joe and Louise were Directors for the 1990 Canadian National Convention, holding the position of chair couple for Social and Special Events.


They served on both the 1993 and 1995 B.C. Festival committees looking after Heritage and they also served on both B.C. Ball and Promotion Committees.


